## Purpose

The Sunday School Program at Powhatan OFWB Church is established to provide a study of God's Word through weekly lessons and recommended scripture study. The congregation is broken into classes by age, social groups, or interests. A superintendent and assistant is elected each year and they conduct the preliminary activities opening each Sunday morning service. Services begin at 9:45 with preliminary prayers, singing, and announcements before the group is dismissed to individual classes.

Each class has a teacher/assistant teacher(s) and there is an attendance roll/offering form completed and turned in to the secretary before the class begins the morning lesson. The secretary prepares a summary report from each class report and posts the information on a display board. The secretary rings a bell around 10:45 to note the time to dismiss the class and re-assemble in the sanctuary for morning worship service at 11 a.m.

A nominating committee each spring (May/June) interviews and recommends a slate of teachers and assistants for the coming year through the junior class age. The committee seeks input from current teachers for interest in continuing to serve. The congregation votes on this proposed slate of officers. Traditionally, assistants serve each month's 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday or in case of an absence. Adult classes elect their own teachers and assistants. Each class is encouraged to have additional activities during the year for fellowship, outreach, & encouragement.

## Additional Information

The new Sunday School year begins each July and new teachers begin serving at that time. The descriptions and age categories for each class is not set in stone and we would like for each member to feel comfortable in the class they choose to be a part of. The classes for the young people take into consideration the skill levels such as ability to read, ability to sit still for a :45 minute period, and ability to understand morality issues and themes.

Any question or concern about the Sunday School program should be addressed to the superintendent. As changes occur during a year, the superintendent should be kept informed. Any needed supplies are ordered by the superintendent.

Teachers are needed to be trained, prepared, faithful, and dedicated to sharing the Gospel. Youth teachers should have a special love for young people and an understanding of the abilities and interests of the particular age group being taught. The Annual Sunday School Institute offers training (1<sup>st</sup> Saturday of March at MOC).

The Sunday School sponsors a gift program at Christmas. Teachers purchase a \$5 gift for each student on their roll on behalf of the church. Checks should be obtained from the treasurer or a receipt turned in for reimbursement.

The denomination sponsors a program to honor outstanding Sunday School workers. Powhatan has had several candidates recognized with certificates. For nominations, see the superintendent.
